**Infinity Farm** is a local organic/biodynamic farm located on 161 beautiful acres of rolling pastures, hardwood forest and several ponds. All of our produce is grown without the use of chemical fertilizers, pesticides and herbicides. We practice sound principles of organic farming and also make use of special homeopathic herbal "preparations" to grow the best food possible. By working with nature, we are able to improve the quality of the land which ultimately benefits everyone.



In 2004, we will be growing over 50 varieties of vegetables plus strawberries on five acres. A small herd of cattle and a flock of chickens were established in 2003. We are currently marketing most of our produce through our CSA and a limited amount through the Hillsborough farmers' market.

# frequently asked questions

## What is a CSA and how does it work?

CSA is an acronym for Community Supported Agriculture. Before the growing season begins, the farmer sells shares of the farm's harvest, often called memberships. In return, members receive their share of the farm's produce, which is distributed once a week during the growing season (6-7 months) and which varies each week depending on the time of year and crop success. A closer relationship develops between the consumer and farmer in this way and the produce is usually less expensive than at stores and farmers' markets.

## What is biodynamic agriculture?

### How does it differ from organic agriculture?

Biodynamic agriculture is a method of farming and gardening that incorporates good organic farming practices, but does not stop there. Specific herbal preparations are applied to the compost piles and also sprayed directly on the fields. These preparations have been shown to enhance nutrient uptake, root formation and photosynthesis resulting in superior crops.

## What if I want only a few kinds of vegetables and herbs?

CSAs usually grow a wide variety of crops to try to satisfy most diets and preferences. We will grow more of the popular veggies and herbs and fewer of the exotic ones. CSAs work best for people that include numerous vegetables in their diet. Recipes will be offered each week.

## Do I need a full share or a half share?

A full share is intended for a family of three or more or for couples who emphasize veggies in their diet. A half share is for singles and couples with a modest vegetable diet.

## Where and when can I pick up my share?

Shares can be picked up at the farm. Also, several pick up sites will be set up for your convenience. Sites and times will be determined before **April 15** and notice given to members.
